

## ABSTRACT

Parenting is physical and psychology treatment to a child. Toilet training is a process of teaching a child on proper controlling desire for urination and defecation. This research aims at investigating the correlation between parenting and the success of toilet training for toddlers at Ilomangga, Tabungo sub-district of Gorontalo district.

The research is designed using cross sectional method; data is collected from different subjects at the same time. The sample consists of 120 respondents taken by purposive sampling, and the instruments are questionnaire and observation using Chi-Square at the significance level of  $\alpha=0.05$ .

The result shows that democratic, authoritative, and permissive parenting in toilet training had correlation where  $P_{value}$  of these three parenting was 0.000 with  $P_{value} < \alpha$  ( $0.000 < 0.05$ ). It can be concluded that there was a significant correlation between parenting and the success of toilet training at Ilomangga village, Gorontalo district.

It is suggested for parents to give the right and proper toilet training for the children, maintaining the cleanliness, and teaching them to be independent.
