

ABSTRACT

Many acceptors of contraceptive injection are lack of understanding toward side effects suffered by women encountering contraceptive injection. To tackle and reduce the issue, it requires information presentation such as counseling conducted by health care that maternal knowledge about contraceptive injection can be increased.

The research aimed at understanding the effect of health education toward knowledge of contraceptive injection on women of childbearing age.

The research was categorized to pre experimental research through one group pretest and posttest design. Population was amounted to 33 women of childbearing age and considered as samples through the application of accidental sampling. Data analysis used univariate and bivariate analysis with Wilcoxon Test.

The result showed that there was an effect of health education toward knowledge of contraceptive injection on women of childbearing age with level of significance $p = 0,000$. It is recommended to people particularly mothers to improve their knowledge and seek for information about contraceptive injection at nearby Puskesmas.
