CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

There are two things covered in this chapter, conclusion and suggestion. The conclusion will be based on the research findings above and the suggestion will leads the further research on the same field.

Conclusion

After analyzing and discussing the politeness strategies by Brown and Levinson used in the great Gatsby movie, the researcher can conclude that there are many politeness strategies applied in this movie. As mentioned above, politeness is a communication strategy that people use to maintain and develop relationships (related goal). There are four politeness strategies by Brown and Levinson, namely bald on record, positive politeness, negative politeness, and off record. In this movie, those four strategies are applied by portrayed characters although not all the strategies are covered. Based on the finding of the study, it can be conclude there are some kinds of bald on record found in this movie, such as cases of non-minimization of the face threat, the granting permission for something that has been requested, task oriented, to reduce the hearer's anxieties and rejecting request. Therefore, positive politeness are avoid disagreement, which is token agreement, be optimistic, offering, exaggerates, offer and promise, include both S and H in the activity, notice, give or ask for reason, assert or presuppose speaker knowledge of and concern from hearer wants, and provides effort to minimize. Whereas types of negative politeness found in movie are indirect order, beg forgiveness, nominalize, don't assume about H's wants, be direct, give deference lowering of one self, minimize the imposition and give overwhelming reasons. Last strategy that analyzed in movie is off record strategy. The kinds of this strategy that found are be ironic, pre-sequence, and methapors.

Suggestion

Since this study focuses on the usage of politeness strategies used in the great Gatsby movie. This study contributes on the improvement of understanding language studies especially on politeness strategies connected to literary works so it will become a direct contribution to the existing knowledge in the field of linguistic. This study can also lead the

next researcher who conducts the same field of research as the reference or comparison that might be relevant to the researched subject. To expand this area of investigation, the researcher hopes to the next researcher to conduct research on politeness strategies in the other form of literary works such as poetry and drama in the purpose of enriching the pragmatic studies. It is also hoped that the study on politeness involving language other than English, so it can be broaden the knowledge in applying linguistic aspect in various languages.
