Chapter V: Conclusion and Recommendations

This chapter covered two things, there are conclusions and recommendations. The conclusion will be based on finding and analysis of the research in preceding chapter whereas the recommendations will leads for other researchers and English learners who want to conduct researches on the same field that is politeness strategies in pragmatics area.

Conclusion

This research was identifying the strategies of politeness that used by the main characters of *High Strung* 2016 movie. In this study, the researcher used Brown and Levinson theory to analyze and discuss the politeness strategies. There are four politeness strategies items, namely Bald on Record strategy, Positive strategy, Negative strategy, and Off Record strategy. Having finished with the analysis, the researcher can conclude there are 45 data of politeness strategies applied in *High Strung* 2016 movie. The strategies are applied by the main characters, even though not overall the substrategies in each types of politeness are used in this movie.

Start from first strategy that is Bald on Record, it has been found Cases of FTA-oriented bald-on-record usage. Second strategy is Positive politeness that analyzed in this movie applied in eight strategies there are notice, exaggerate, group identity markers, seek agreement, offer and promise, optimistic, , and include both speaker hearer in the activity, and give or ask for the reason. While Negative politeness strategy has three kinds that exist in this movie there are be conventionally indirect, pessimistic, and apology. Lastly, there are two strategies in the sample of Off Record there are understate and tautologies.

Recommendations

Based on the conclusion above, the current research gives some recommendations for the readers and the the future study. The recommendations are presenting below:

For the readers.

The main purpose of this research has been achieved through the application of linguistics theory in politeness strategies one of the American movie entitled *High Strung* movie in 2016. This research has been conducted strategies of politeness in pragmatics study of that movie directed by Janeen Damian and Michael Damian. The researcher hopes the findings and analysis gives several benefits for all the readers in understanding how the main characters applying utterances that contain politeness strategies based on Brown and Levinson theory as the one of references. The researcher recommends for the readers can improve their knowledge in analyzing politeness strategies particularly in literary works for instance movie.

Further, the researcher also recommends to the readers doing research of politeness strategies because there are many linguistics politenesses that should be identified in several literary or non-literary works. The current research only focuses on the utterances containing strategies of politeness used in the main characters in the Movie.
