Chapter 5: Conclusion and Suggestion

This chapter aims at concluding the conclusion drawing of the study and also some suggestions that the researcher wants to convey for the reader and students also suggestion for the further study.

Conclusion

In this case, the researcher concluded that the fourth semester students known to have passed Basic English Grammar and Advanced English Grammar still produced error. The students tend to make error almost in every types of error. Moreover, from 88 answer sheets that have been collected, there are several types of error on the indicators of present perfect tense which are auxiliary, past participle, and adverb of time found in students' answer sheets. Then, those errors are described using surface category taxonomy from Dulay et al (1982), such as omission, addition, misformation, and misordering.

Suggestion

Based on the conclusion above, there are several suggestion that could be presented for this research. First this research is expected to give an additional knowledge for students of English Department regarding with types of error in present perfect tense. Hence, in order to reduce those errors, they should increase their knowledge and awareness related with the use of present perfect tense on their writing. Besides that, this research is also expected to convey the information for the lecturers related with

students' ability and their difficulties in utilizing present perfect tense on their writing.

Based on the result of this research, there are several error that produced by students, which means that the lecturers should make some improvement in teaching and learning process. Moreover, this research is expected to be useful for readers who find problems in learning how to use Present Perfect Tense. Furthermore, this research could be a reference for the further researcher who attempts to investigate the same issue about present perfect tense in different types of writing. Besides that, they also could analyze grammatical errors on tenses in wider analysis.
