

## Chapter V: Conclusion and Suggestions

This chapter provides the conclusion and suggestions that are offered after doing the analysis of the corpus. Conclusion is formulated based on the answer to the research question of this research. Further, the suggestions are aimed for the readers or the researchers who want to do a research in this field.

### Conclusion

As defined in the introduction, every language has its own rule, which in morphology it is called word formation process. This rule is used in order to forming new words and it also prevails in forming slang as what has been found in this research. Slang is known as an informal language that is used in informal situation. The appearance of it is quite instant, but word formation process still happens in it.

In conducting this study, the researcher used the *Gen Z* slang that is in Callahan's Generation Z Dictionary as the object. Further, in analysing the corpus, the researcher applied Mattiello and Yule's combination theories. There are 15 types of word formation process that proposed by Mattiello (2008) and Yule (2010), and eight of them are found in this research. They are fanciful formation, compounding, blending, clipping, conversion, suffixation, multiple process, and reduplicatives.

Moreover, the finding signified that compounding is the most used type of word formation process. It means that the *Gen Z* slang terms that are in Callahan's Generation Z Dictionary mostly are formed by combining bases. However, besides combining bases, this study indicates that the slang terms are also created

by adding suffixes, combining two or more processes, changing the grammatical category, shortening bases and repeating bases. In brief, this study exhibits the diversity of word formation process that ensues in *Gen Z* slang in Callahan's Generation Z Dictionary. Nevertheless, the finding of this research just prevails for *Gen Z* slang term that are in Callahan's Generation Z Dictionary and it cannot be generalized.

### **Suggestions**

#### ***Researchers***

This study is expected to give inspiration to other researchers who want to conduct researches in this field. Moreover, there are some suggestions for further researchers who want to do this kind of research. The first is they can continue this research by seeing from the perspective of sociolinguistics. It is because this present research just focuses on the structure form of the slang. Therefore, the further researcher can do a study that see the way of the *Gen Z* uses their slang.

The second is they can conduct the same research as this present research, but they need to change the subject of the research. The further researchers can build their own corpus by combining several sources that present the *Gen Z* slang. Therefore, the result of their research can be generalised. It is suggested because there are lots of slang terms, which are not covered in this research.

The third is the further researcher can arrange a study that sees the *Gen Z* slang in Indonesian and the influence of English in the *Gen Z* slang. English is one

of languages that has lots of speakers around the world, hence it probably has influence in the invention of *Gen Z* slang in *bahasa*.

The fourth is the further researchers can apply different theory with this study in order to give new perspective to the readers or do a combination research between morphology and phonology. The fifth is the further researchers can do a comparison research about the *Gen Z* and other generations' slang. Specifically, the further researchers can investigate the types of word formation of each generation's slang due to compare about the type of word formation that influence in forming the generations' slang.

### ***Lexicographers***

Since this study uses a dictionary hence, it is expected to inspire language learners or lexicographers to create a Standard Dictionary of *Gen Z* slang. It is tended to maintain this generation language and also to provide information for people who want to understand or study about *Gen Z*. The dictionary can be in English or in other languages since *Gen Z* is everywhere.
